





# Easter Read and Rhyme Game

Roll the dice and land on a word. Think of a word which rhymes and say it out aloud. The winner is the first one to the finish line!














































# Easter Scavenger Hunt

A spin on the classic! Draw a lovely bunny character and use your colouring or painting skills to bring him to life!




# Egg and spoon race

The grass is getting greener, flowers start to bloom.



## Bake some Easter goodies!

Use your reading and measuring skills and create some lovely Easter treats. You could make some rice cripsie or cornflake buns and add some mini eggs on top, or how about trying one of our recipes?

#### Mini Egg rocky road

#### **Ingredients**

175g/6oz dark chocolate, broken into pieces

125g/4 ½ oz milk chocolate, broken into pieces

2 tbsp golden syrup

75g/2 ¾ oz unsalted butter, diced

160g/5 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> oz sugar coated chocolate mini eggs

200g/7oz digestives or rich tea biscuits, broken into pieces

75g/2 3/4 oz hazelnuts, roughly chopped

75g/2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> oz raisins



#### Method

- 1. Line a 20 x 30cm baking tin with baking paper
- 2. Put the dark and milk chocolate pieces into a large heatproof bowl, add the golden syrup and butter
- 3. Set the bowl with the chocolate over a pan of simmering water, but do not let the bottom of the bowl touch the water. Make sure an adult does this!
- 4. Stir from time to time until the butter and chocolate are melted and the mixture is smooth. Remove from the heat and leave to cool for 5 minutes you don't want the marshmallows to melt!
- 5. Cut the chocolate mini eggs in half, but leave a few whole for decorating. Set one third of the eggs aside. Gently fold the chocolate eggs, biscuits, marshmallows, nuts and raisins into the chocolate mixture and combine
- 6. Spoon the mixture into the tin and level using the back of the spoon. Scatter the remaining mini eggs on the top
- 7. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour or completely firm. Cut into bars to serve.



## Pebble decorating

Could you decorate some pebbles to look like Easter eggs?



#### **Rock painting**

#### You will need

Rocks (oval shape, to look like eggs)

Acrylic paint

Paintbrushes (medium for painting the entire rock and small for the details)

Cotton wool buds

Weatherproof sealer

#### Method

- 1. Firstly, make sure your rocks are clean and dry. Give them a good wash!
- 2. Get your paints ready and choose a paint to cover your entire rock. Pastel colours work well. Make sure the paint is dry before you move on
- 3. When the rock is dry, use a small paintbrush to paint on zig zags and lines or cotton wool buds to add dots
- 4. Leave your rocks to dry overnight. When dry, seal the rocks using a weatherproof sealer
- 5. You could use these for gifts, on an Easter hunt or leave them when you go on a walk for somebody else to find!
