# Uniform Expectations

We are proud of students and how they represent their community. We pride them on being smart and ready to learn each day, skills that they will take into the world of work. We really value your support in ensuring their uniform meets academy expectations and that they are prepared everyday with their tools for learning; schoolbag, planner and basic equipment. # Uniform Policy Update

In reviewing the policy, we have taken the decision to remove the requirement for students to wear logoed trousers and skirts. This change will be effective from 1 January 2023. Students will still be required to wear appropriate school trousers and skirts, as described in the letter sent home in December 2022. Students wearing items that do not match these descriptions will be asked to change and support will be given to parents/carers to source acceptable garments. There is a guide on our website that includes images of what is and is not acceptable that students, parents and carers may find useful when purchasing non-logoed school trousers and skirts.
